



## **SAU at AUA Meeting Spring 2027 Program Co Chairs**

### **About the Role**

The SAU at the AUA Meeting Spring 2027 convenes the day prior to the official AUA annual meeting and occurs concurrently to other subspecialty society meetings. While the SAU Annual Meeting in the Winter focuses on matters related to education, the Spring meeting focuses on matters related to academic urology at large with a focus on chairs and urologic leadership. The meeting includes brief updates from AUA, SAU, ABU, RRC, ACURE, RFJUS, SWIU, expert talks, moderated panels, grant updates, and annual business meetings during the lunch hour. The program Co Chairs develop a timely program agenda of value of membership to drive attendance and amplify engagement in the SAU mission. SAU attempts to select diverse Program Co Chairs to include program directors, associate program directors and chairs across the country to balance representation. They will liaison closely with the SAU Chair of the Program Committee who is the incoming President Elect as well as Veritas Executive and Associate Directors.

### **Responsibilities Include:**

- Working under the oversight of the SAU Chair of the Program Committee who is the incoming President Elect to develop the program agenda for the 1 day SAU at the AUA Meeting in the Spring of 2027.
- Review past programs and feedback, develop themes and topics relevant to the society and audience, solicit and invite speakers and moderators.
- Collaborate with Veritas staff to maintain agenda, address changes, provide communication to stakeholders, complete CME requirements.
- Engage with industry partners to the extent that is relevant to the programming agenda
- Follow up with the AUA to provide draft and final agendas.

### **Desired Qualifications:**

- Active SAU member in good standing.
- Demonstrated experience in academic urology, medical education, research, educational or clinical scholarship.
- Prior attendance at SAU meetings and prior involvement in SAU mission including task forces, committees, speakerships at meetings.

- Strong vision for themes and topics and diverse speakers of interest for the Spring meeting which focuses on academic urology, (with slightly less focus on residency education since this is covered at the Winter meeting), faculty development and reaches a wide audience of chairs, program directors and faculty.
- Strong organizational skills, responsiveness to email, long term planning and consistent follow up.
